

OVING RECREATION GROUND RULES

1. Oving Parish Council are the custodians of Oving Recreation Ground.
2. Oving Recreation Ground is for the benefit of all Oving residents.
3. Any matter or incident involving the Recreation Ground, or its users, must be reported as soon as possible to the Clerk to the Parish Council. In an emergency, please call the appropriate emergency service immediately and then inform the Clerk as soon as possible.
4. Access to the Recreation Ground by emergency vehicles must always be available and under no circumstances can the Emergency Access Barrier ever be blocked. Organisers of events on the Recreation Ground and/or representatives of Clubs using the Recreation Ground are responsible for ensuring that access is always available to emergency vehicles.
5. In the event of an emergency, a telephone is available in the pavilion for summoning emergency services.
6. The children's playground, and the play equipment in it, is for the exclusive use of children under the age of eleven.
7. Livestock may be grazed on the Recreation Ground, provided prior written permission has been given by Oving Parish Council.
8. Organised events can only take place on the Recreation Ground by prior agreement with the Parish Council. All requests should be addressed to the Clerk.
9. Motorised vehicles of any kind are prohibited from the Recreation Ground, other than the designated car park, unless prior permission has been granted by the Parish Council.
10. Dogs are only permitted on the Recreation Ground if they are kept under control and on a lead at all times. Dogs are not permitted within the children's playground under any circumstances.
11. Fouling of the Recreation Ground, or any other public area, by dogs is an offence, and any owners failing to clear up after their dogs risk a fine of up to £1,000 as detailed in the Environmental Protection Act 1990, the Litter Order 1991 and the Dogs Act 1996.
12. The use of any foul or abusive language or behaviour which would be reasonably deemed to offend will not be tolerated. Furthermore in the event of persistent abusive language or behaviour the Parish Council will remove with immediate effect the right of access and permission for clubs and associations to use the facilities.
